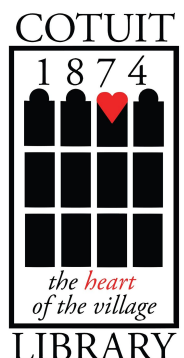

Michael Petrasco and Steve Davies of Insight Observatory are bringing a real treat to Cotuit Library. Boasting two remote stargazing telescopes located at an elevation of 7,778 ft in the dark skies of western New Mexico, workshop participants will be paired up to choose deep-sky object to take an image for later viewing and downloading. Steve, a licensed astronomy and physics teacher, will give a brief lecture on deep-sky imaging with the telescopes before image selection. Materials cost is \$10 per person. Birding in Peru: Amazon to Andes with Mark Faherty

Boasting vast Amazonian jungles, a long Pacific coastline, and astounding altitudinal habitat diversity, Peru is neck in neck with Columbia for the most bird species of any country in the world. Club board member and Mass Audubon Wellfleet Bay science coordinator Mark Faherty will take us on a journey through Peru's wild Amazon lowlands from north to south, up to the lakes of the high Andes, then to the cloud forests of the eastern Andean slope, and finally the coastal deserts of Lima. In addition to the expected parrots and monkeys, we'll also see the prehistoric Hoatzin, the endemic Inca Wren, some flamingos, and maybe even a Horned Screamer, whatever that is. We'll even visit a remote Amazonian village and the famous Incan citadel of Machu Picchu.

Pathways of Peru Documentary - Time Scanners: Machu Picchu

Wednesday, February 27th @ 4:00 PM

Our Pathways of Peru documentary for this month brings us to Machu Picchu in PBS' Time Scanners: Machu Picchu:

"The dense jungle of the Peruvian Andes hides a sacred city - Machu Picchu, an enchanted 500-year-old stone citadel, hidden deep in the mountains where not even the Spanish conquistadores could find it. Thanks to its location on a precarious ridge in Peru's sacred mountains, Machu Picchu is one of the most inaccessible cities in the world; there's still much that we don't know about the city and the people who lived there.

Using cutting-edge, 3D laser-scanning technology, structural engineer Steve Burrows leads his team of experts into the Peruvian jungle to scan the sacred Incan city, asking three main questions: How did the Incas build a city atop a mountain ridge? How were the terraces constructed? And how did they supply water to the city? Join the team as they turn back time and decode the past."

After the viewing Steve Burrows will hold a Q&A session via Skype.
