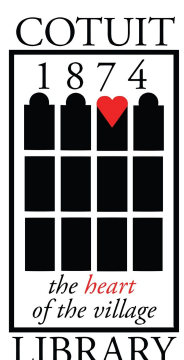

## Documentary: Ghosts of Machu Picchu

Saturday, March 2nd @ 2:00 PM

We have another intriguing documentary on Machu Picchu for our Pathways of Peru programming with PBS' Ghosts of Machu Picchu: "Perched atop a mountain crest, mysteriously abandoned more than four centuries ago, Machu Picchu is the most famous archeological ruin in the Western hemisphere and an iconic symbol of the power and engineering prowess of the Inca. In the years since Machu Picchu was discovered by Hiram Bingham in 1911, there have been countless theories about this "Lost City of the Incas," yet it remains an enigma. Why did the Incas build it on such an inaccessible site, clinging to the steep face of a mountain? Who lived among its stone buildings, farmed its emerald green terraces, and drank from its sophisticated aqueduct system? NOVA joins a new generation of archeologists as they robe areas of Machu Picchu that haven't been touched since the time of the Incas and unearth burials of the people who built the sacred site. Ghosts of Machu Picchu explores the extraordinary trail of clues that began on that fateful day in 1911 and continues to the present."

## Saint Patrick's Place in Irish History

Saturday, March 16th @ 2:00 PM

Saint Patrick is the most famous person associated with Ireland. He is the Patron saint of Ireland and is recognized as having played a major role in the Christianization of Ireland. There are many myths and legends associated with Patrick. This talk will look at the historical record based on available facts and accepted understandings. The talk will also reference the written works of Saint Patrick.

Patrick was kidnapped in Britain by Irish slave traders and taken to Ireland as a slave at age sixteen. He escaped after six years. He returned as a bishop in his forties and spent twenty five years ministering to the existing Christian community in Ireland - mostly foreign slaves and refugees - and helped to convert the indigenous Irish.

This talk given by Irish Historian Sean Murphy will examine the historical context of his mission in Ireland. This includes a review of the development of Irish society prior to his arrival; an overview of the history of Christianity in England and Ireland; an examination of the crises in Europe as the Roman Empire collapsed and how this impacted the situation in Ireland in the fourth and fifth centuries.

## Sci-Fi Book Club "First Contact" Meeting

The Cotuit Library Sci-Fi Book Club is making First Contact! That is to say: we are going to be having our first meeting at the Library Wednesday evening in our lovely little art room upstairs, and discussing *Binti*, the first novella of Nnedi Okorafor's critically acclaimed *Binti* Trilogy. Copies will be available for checkout at the library and in ebook form on Libby leading up to the event.

Check out this synopsis on *Binti* and then come to the library and grab your copy:

"She left her home for the stars, but found more adventure than she bargained for. A tense and intimate coming-of-age story in space.

"Her name is *Binti*, and she is the first of the Himba people ever to be offered a place at Oomza University, the finest institution of higher learning in the galaxy. But to accept the offer will mean giving up her place in her family to travel between the stars among strangers who do not share her ways or respect her customs.

"Knowledge comes at a cost, one that *Binti* is willing to pay, but her journey will not be easy. The world she seeks to enter has long warred with the Meduse, an alien race that has become the stuff of nightmares. Oomza University has wronged the Meduse, and *Binti*'s stellar travel will bring her within their deadly reach.

"If *Binti* hopes to survive the legacy of a war not of her making, she will need both the gifts of her people and the wisdom enshrined within the universe itself - but first she has to make it there alive."
